

Icy dinosaur eggs

You will need:

Balloons
Small toy dinosaurs
2 bowls
jug/toy watering can



What you need to do:

- Blow up a balloon to stretch it but don't tie the end.
- Deflate the balloon.
- Open the end of the balloon and push the toy dinosaur into the balloon. This can be tricky.
- Attach the balloon to the cold water tap and fill with water. Not too much you don't want to pop it!
- Tie the end and put in the freezer. You can make more than one.
- When completely frozen take out of the freezer.
- Cut off the end of the balloon and then peel the balloon off the ice.
- Put the ice eggs in a bowl.
- Have a bowl of warm water nearby, about the temperature of your child's bath water.
- Use a jug, child's watering can or anything else you have to hand to safely pour small amounts of the warm water onto the eggs. This should melt the eggs slowly, enough for your child to get the dinosaurs out.
- Let you child experiment and see if warm water melts the eggs quicker than cold water.
